WHERE SHOULD MEMBERS REPORT ACTIVITY RELATED TO BLOOD DRIVES?

If the blood drive is specific to the military, then that is counted under National Security. If specific to a VA facility, then it is counted under VA&R.

If it is directed to the community or region – anything other than specific to military or veterans – it should be reported under Community Service.

Working or donating at a blood drive should be counted as impact under the appropriate category.
