- You can schedule "Veterans in Community Schools" programs locally or participate in Veterans Day and Memorial Day programs, instilling respect for those who have served and sacrificed for our country. Be sure to contact schools early to express your interest.
- You can have a "Purple Up Day" in schools. By having activities at your local post and have activities for the children, Have a panel of young adults to share about their experiences growing up in a military family.
- Seek out and support local veterans who are pursuing higher education and vocational education.
