Support Military Families

Support active-duty military families through working with an installation Family Readiness Group (FRG). Each branch has its own name for their respective group.

Collaborate with like-minded organizations such as Blue Star Families, the USO, and other local organizations to support service members and their families.

Support families whose service members made the ultimate sacrifice through working with organizations such Gold Star Mothers, Gold Star Families, and the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS).

Raise Awareness of POW/MIAs

Promote use of a POW/MIA flag, chair cover or Missing Man Table at meetings and events.

Recognize POW/MIA Recognition Day - the third Friday in September.

Salute to Servicemembers Award
