Activities to consider:

- Donate to a food bank, contribute to a clothing drive, participate in walk/run to support a charity, or provide support for shelters for women and children.
- Support local youth organizations.
- Participate in a blood drive, or first aid or CPR training.
- Assist with community events sponsored by like-minded organizations.
- Participate in the Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Service. Information about ways
