Honor Flight Network is a national nonprofit organization comprised of independent hubs working together to achieve the Honor Flight mission. In furtherance of this common goal, we have the enormous privilege of showing our nation's veterans the appreciation and honor they deserve.

Participation in an Honor Flight trip gives veterans the opportunity to share this momentous occasion with other comrades, remember the fallen, and share their stories and experiences with other veterans. Honored veterans always travel free of charge, thanks to generous donations to our organization.

While initially focused solely on America's World War II era veterans, Honor Flight Network has expanded its mission to include those who served during the Korean War and the Vietnam War eras.

The Honor Flight TLC program also honors veterans of any service era who are critically ill.

How to get involved:

- Volunteer as a Guardian – You're paired with a veteran to give physical assistance, logistical support and companionship. You will be expected to pay your way. Spouses/significant others are not eligible to be Guardians.
- Be a greeter – Greeters for incoming honor flights are needed at both Reagan National Airport and Dulles International Airport, as well as at local DC memorials and the hotel where Honor Flight participants are staying. Contact your local Honor Flight Hub to ask about volunteering as a greeter for Honor Flight arrivals and departures in your area.
- Write a letter – Every Veteran that flies on Honor Flight gets an envelope full of letters from their family and friends, the community, and from students. Mail Call is one of the most memorable parts of their day. To participate, individuals are encouraged to send letters and cards prior to each flight, with specific guidelines on what can be included. Contact your local hub regarding guidelines for Mail Call items.
